KEJIMKUJIK: A LAND OF NATURAL AND HISTORIC SIGNIFICANCE

Only moments off the beaten path, and 45 minutes from Annapolis, Kejimkujik offers a unique blend of nature and culture with all of the activities and services of a national park and a national historic site. Protecting 381 square kilometres of lush forests, gentle rolling hills and interconnected lakes and rivers, Kejimkujik is a wilderness where generations of families have canoed, camped and connected with nature. Diverse woodlands and wetlands bursting with birds, wildflowers, turtles and mammals create a biodiversity hotspot! Volunteer today in meaningful, hands-on research and join the scientists on one of our species at risk monitoring programs to help protect wildlife and restore habitats. The entire landscape of Kejimkujik is also designated a national historic site. It is a cultural landscape that attests to the presence of the Mi'kmaq and their ancestors

since time immemorial and is home to the largest collection of petroglyphs in eastern North America. These rock carvings, as well as ancient canoe routes and encampment areas, tell the stories of the land and its people. Join an interpreter and immerse yourself in the culture embedded in this historically significant area.

In sharp contrast to the National Park's inland landscape is Kejimkujik Seaside, a wild and isolated stretch of coastline where headlands sweep gently to an easily accessible pristine white-sand beach and secluded rocky coves. Situated 100 km southwest of the main park, Keji Seaside protects 22 kilometres of the most beautiful coastal wilderness in the region where you'll encounter seals, seabirds and endless crashing waves. Grab a picnic lunch and stroll the scenic trails.

Starting this summer, Keji campers will be able to "plug in" and enjoy the conveniences of electricity while camping in Jeremy's Bay. Sixty-three electrical sites will be available for reservations beginning June 30th.
