Annapolis County Parks, Trails & Open Spaces

This popular brochure includes a map and 40 outdoor adventures. Whether you walk, jog, hike, cycle, paddle, bird watch, garden, fish, cross country ski or enjoy traveling by car, the diverse landscape with its picturesque parks, scenic vistas, trails and beautiful sunsets will inspire you.

Delaps Cove Wilderness Trail

Stroll through the lush forest and emerge for a breath of salt air on the rugged, windswept coastline of the Bay of Fundy. This is a nature lover and photographer's paradise. Interpretation sites and picnic areas offer wonderful opportunities for special educational and pleasurable wilderness adventures. Located only approx. 24 km (15 miles) northwest of Annapolis, Delaps Cove has two scenic wilderness trails, Bohaker and Charlie's, each with its own unique ecosystem. The abandoned Old Shore Rd. links them. Bohaker Trail has a magnificent waterfall.



Raven Haven Beachside Family Park

Raven Haven, open mid-June to Sept. 2, is a 4-acre family-oriented park on the scenic shores of nearby Sandy Bottom Lake, owned by the Municipality of Annapolis County, managed by Recreation Services. Reservations are recommended for the campsites, cabins and hostel. Enjoy a beautiful public beach, picnic site and playground with a fully-stocked canteen. Mickey Hill Pocket Wilderness

This beautiful and secluded wilderness area is located on Rt. 8 about 10 minutes from Annapolis on the way out towards Kejimikujik National Park. It features scenic walking trails, a picnic area and beach. Interpretive signs posted.

The artists will work in all styles, from traditional to contemporary, in a variety of media including oil, acrylic, watercolour, iron, stone, wood and photography. In previous years, they have produced an average of over 500 pieces of art over the Paint the Town weekend.

The public is invited to watch the artists at work. Bids can be placed on art as soon as it reaches the Paint the Town Gallery at The Academy between 10 am - 6 pm Final bids by 6 pm each day.
